Sam, Sounds, Sweat, Shots, Storms, Seals

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① The new building at the **Sam's Point** parking lot is truly gorgeous. It was funded by Open Space Institute and The Nature Conservancy, the owners of the *Sam's Point Preserve*. It fits in very nicely with the environment and will, no doubt, educate many people on the rare species of the area.

© The Fourth of July is fun for people, but animals are terrified by the loud noise. Please keep your pets inside all day and night during this time. So many are lost when they

run away from home due to fear.

NEVER take your dog to a fireworks event. I give tranquilizers to the real basket cases and they drowse through the whole thing. If you cannot get meds from your vet, put your pet in a room with the TV or radio playing. Do not give a pet a human tranquilizer and also ask the vet what to do, as he or she needs to know the pet's weight to know how much to prescribe. Do not wait until the last minute to call for the tranquilizers. You need to call the vet today. Give it two hours ahead of time; an hour doesn't give it long enough to kick in, because the pet will already be getting stressed.

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After a long winter the sun feels good on our skins and many people in our area love to walk, run, and bike. Since dogs are such good pals, it's only natural to want to take your pet along. BUT WAIT. Dogs have a fur coat on, and only sweat through their tongue. That is, they need cool air to blow across the tongue to keep cool. Water alone is not enough. Dogs are also not made for exercise in hot weather, unless it's swimming. So what I'm getting at is, it would be kinder and safer to leave dogs at home in air-conditioning, or in a cool yard, than to take them out in the car or for a run or long hike. Remember, the pads of their feet can get very hot, whereas we have shoes on.

Of course, he would do anything or go anywhere you ask him to, so it's up to the human to make the better decision for the dog. I would never risk taking my dog on a summer walk from the top of the mountain on a two or more mile hike. Not only are there rattlesnakes, but a dog that has not exercised all winter, and if it were over 80 degrees, would really suffer. Animals get heat stroke just as people do. A walk up to the lake by **Sam's Point** might be ok, because he or she could swim when they get there, but that is not even a mile walk. Anything more would be wrong. It's just better to leave the dog at home.

© Be sure to get your pets their rabies shots at least every three years. This is the law and very important for protecting your family and community against the fatal disease. There is no reason not to get the shots except laziness. Even if you can't afford the veterinary office, you can take your pet to a clinic. All you have to do is ask at the town office. You can also get the shots at clinics in other towns. If you would like complete information on the disease you can ask your town clerk to get you that.





People are very negligent who expose visitors or neighbors to an unvaccinated pet. The people might have cuts on their hands and not realize that the pet is incubating the disease. We all know to stay away from wild animals, but we just assume our friends' pets are up to date on their shots. You also need to go to a vet to be sure your pet does not have worms that could transfer to small kids who do not wash their hands. I personally think no one should have a pet who does not put aside some money for his or her basic care.

© We just had a wild thunderstorm and now the air smells so good and I marvel at the bright green, new growth of the pines against the backdrop of the forest floor. I heard the flute-like song of the woodthrush among the other birds – my favorite. The roses and mountain laurel are slow this year,

but they will reward us for our patience.
