Nine members of the 11-member *Ulster County Charter Commission* met June 20<sup>th</sup> in the **Media Room** (photo above) of the *Ellenville High School*, as one of a series of meetings held throughout the county to allow citizens in all regions to observe the commission in action. Charged with drafting a revamped charter for county government, to be ratified by the Legislature and public referendum before implementation, they've already voted for the following: reapportionment and Legislature salaries should be handled by an independent community group, rather than by county lawmakers; retain partisan elections and part-time rather than full-time Legislators; backing the 2003 public referendum to reduce the Legislature from 33 to 23 members in 2012, with single-member districts rather than the multimember districts now in place. At this meeting, they voted to reject term limits, and to have a county-wide-elected county executive, rather than appoint the Chair from among their own, as today. Talk of staggered four-year terms was tabled without resolution.
